After the production of an archaeological desk-based assessment, it was clear that the presence of the monument ensured the need for further archaeological works. Isabelle managed this programme of archaeological work and lead the clients through the archaeological planning process. Based on the resulting data in discussion with the LPA archaeological officer agreed to the discharge of the archaeological conditions, successfully demonstrating that the development would have no effect on archaeology within the wider area.

**Orestan Lane, Effingham** – Helped to produce a heritage and archaeology report in support of proposals to redevelop the site into a residential area. Challenges included the application site being within a conservation area, adjacent to several listed buildings as well as the being labelled as a key view in reinforcing the rural character of the town.
